# What Is Stewardship?

Many people think stewardship is having a budget and trying to get out of debt. Some think it's writing a check to the church each month. Some think it's taking care of the environment. But those things only scratch the surface of the biblical concept of stewardship. Being a steward means recognizing that everything you have belongs to God (Ps. 24:1)

### 1. Stewardship Is Wise Money Management

Remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth. (Deut. 8:18)

### 2. Stewardship Is Wise Time Management

Socrates warned, "Beware the barrenness of a busy life." Stewardship is not just about money. It's also about how we spend our time.

Be very careful, then, how you live-not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. (Eph. 5:15-16)

# 3. Stewardship Is Wise Talent Management

Stewardship also includes the gifts and talents God has given us. "As each has received a gift [we are to] use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace" (1 Pet. 4:10 ESV).
